

Botanical Layers on Vellum

Project Sheet

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I used the **Botanical Layers Stamp Set** and the **Lovely Layers 3-3/4" x 5" Vellum** on this card. I ink blended 4 of the new In Colors onto a piece of plain vellum to get started. I then stamped several images from the **Botanical Layers Stamp Set** on top of the blended colors. What do you see in the image? A garden at night or an underwater scene? The Parakeet Party ink stamped onto the darker background came out really interesting and shows up a lot better than I expected. I encourage you to give vellum a try and see what you can create. I know I had a lot of fun playing!

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1. Card Cuts:

- Card Base - Cut 1 Starry Sky cardstock to 5-1/2" x 8-1/2", score at 4-1/4"
- Panel - Cut 1 Tahitian Tide cardstock to 5-3/8" x 4-1/8"
- Panel - Basic White cardstock cut 1 to 3-7/8" x 5-1/8"
- Lovely Layers Vellum Panel - already pre-cut to 3-3/4" x 5"
- Inside Panel - Cut 1 Tahitian Tide cardstock to 5-3/8" x 4-1/8"
- Inside Panel - Cut 1 Basic White cardstock to 5-1/4" x 4"
- White scrap for sentiment label
- Starry Sky scrap for sentiment label mat

2. Place a plain piece of vellum from the Lovely Layers Vellum pack onto a piece of scrap paper. You will be blending four of the new 2022-2024 In Colors across the vellum using sponge daubers or ink blenders. Start by blending Parakeet Party ink at the bottom of the panel. Move onto Tahitian Tide ink, Orchid Oasis ink, then lastly, blend Starry Sky ink towards the top of the vellum. After applying one color, you can slightly blend the next color into the previous layer. Allow the vellum layer to completely dry. I gave my piece of vellum about a 1/2 hour to dry. You can use a hair dryer or heat tool to speed the drying time, however, do not over heat the vellum as it will warp.



3. Once the ink is completely dry from step #2 above, you can start stamping images onto the vellum. I used one of the greenery stamps from the Botanical Layers stamp set to stamp in Parakeet Party ink multiple times. The bottom of the images fall within the Parakeet Party blended image on the vellum and I angled the stamp so that the greenery would fall to the left and right of the middle.

4. Next, I stamped a single image of the tropical-looking leaf image in Starry Sky ink. I then

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used the small round stamps to randomly stamp in Starry Sky ink across the vellum. These stamps look a little like floating dandelion heads.

5. Adhering the Vellum to the White Card Panel - **Because adhesives show through on vellum, you will want to be careful on where you place any glue or other adhesive.** I determined the placement of my sentiment label, then applied glue to the vellum in that area. I also applied a very small amount of glue behind the stamped round flower images. The Starry Sky ink is dark enough to disguise the glue drops. Adhere the vellum to the white cardstock panel.
6. Adhere the vellum/white cardstock layer to the Tahitian Tide panel, then adhere this unit to the card front.
7. From a scrap of white cardstock, stamp the "thinking of you" greeting onto the scrap of cardstock. Die cut the sentiment label using the 2nd to smallest label die from the Stylish Shapes Dies set. Die cut a scrap of Starry Sky cardstock using the largest label die from the same die set. Adhere the white label to the Starry Sky label, being sure to center the sentiment label from top to bottom and left to right. Adhere the sentiment label unit to the card front.
8. On the inside white panel, stamp the greenery image from the Botanical Layers stamp set in the lower right corner in Parakeet Party ink, then using Starry Sky ink, stamp the smallest flower image several times around the greenery.
9. As you did in Step #8, stamp the same images using the same ink colors onto the lower right corner of the envelope front and envelope flap.
10. Adhere the inside white panel to the inside Tahitian Tide panel, then adhere this unit to the inside of the card.
11. I chose to use the Rustic Metallic Adhesive-Backed Dots on the card front. I placed four of the larger dots in each corner of the vellum layer. Before applying the dots, though, I placed a small drop of glue under the vellum to secure. The dots hide the glue dots under the vellum. I placed two of the smaller dots on either side of the sentiment.

The card is complete! Blending ink on vellum, then stamping images over top of the blended ink provides a surprising result! The whole point is to experiment and have fun with it!


